
Today, our strength is in our advanced network, the quality of care and community reach. Allina Health is a recognized leader in health care because of you and




# Exceptional maternal care at New Ulm Medical Center

### Groundbreaking AI clinical trial for cancer treatment

The Allina Health Cancer Institute is leading a groundbreaking clinical trial that uses artificial intelligence (AI) and blood samples to revolutionize the diagnosis and treatment of cancer. Dr. Badrinath Konety, MD, MBA, President of the Institute, reports initial results approaching 100% accuracy. The current study focuses on breast cancer, with future research expanding to lung, brain, kidney, and prostate cancers.

Dr. Konety is optimistic about the research's impact. "If our initial findings persist in larger studies, this will be truly remarkable." ### A journey of hope: Saving Halston and Hayes

In November, the Groenwold family celebrated the first birthdays of their beautiful twins, Halston and Hayes. However, the road to this point was far from easy.

At five weeks pregnant, Becca Groenwold of Baxter, MN, received life-altering news — she had a cesarean scar pregnancy. This rare condition posed a significant threat to the health of Becca and her unborn twins. Placenta Accreta, the condition in which the placenta grows into the uterine wall, presented added challenges, especially for mothers with a history of previous c-sections.

Allina Health's Minnesota Perinatal Physicians, recognized as a Placenta Accreta Spectrum Center of Excellence, played a pivotal role in Becca's journey. The specialized team, trained and ready to address complex cases like Becca's, offered a second opinion that transformed the narrative from despair to hope.

Becca recalls, "The appointment with them was drastically different from my first appointment. I felt hope because the doctor was talking to me about the pregnancy and delivery instead of saying the twins could not survive." The compassionate care provided by the team, ensured that Becca and her family were well-informed about all available options, empowering them to make decisions that aligned with their values.

Becca gave birth to Halston and Hayes at 30 weeks pregnant at The Mother Baby Center at Abbott Northwestern Hospital. Throughout her challenging journey, Becca found solace in the sense of community fostered by her fellow patients and the top-tier health care experts at Allina Health.
