☐ safety latches and locks for cabinet drawers in kitchens, bathrooms and other areas	☐ corner and edge bumpers to help prevent injuries from falls against sharp edges of furniture and fireplaces
☐ safety gates for blocking stairs	☐ outlet covers and outlet plates to help prevent electrocution
door knob covers and door locks to prevent entry into rooms that may have dangers	☐ carbon monoxide (CO) detector outside bedrooms to help prevent CO poisoning
☐ anti-scald devices for faucets and shower heads to help prevent burns from hot water	☐ safety tassels and inner cord stops to help prevent strangulation in blind cord loops
☐ smoke detectors on every level of the home and near bedrooms to detect fire	door stops and door holders to help prevent injuries to fingers and hands
☐ window guards and safety netting to help prevent falls from windows, balconies, decks and landings	cordless phone to make it easier when watching your child.
