Meet Linda Ortner



You might say that Linda Ortner was destined to be engaged with philanthropy. Since childhood, Ortner, the new Mercy Hospital Foundation president, has been exposed to the world of volunteering, fund raising and giving.

"You could say that my passion for philanthropy came from my family," said Ortner, who grew up on a farm in northeastern Colorado. "My parents were committed to our community and were always involved with our schools, organizations and church, and all eight of their kids were expected to participate and volunteer, too."

Ortner started out as an educator, then took time off to raise a family. When she returned to the workforce, she felt the pull of her philanthropic roots and took a role recruiting, training and placing volunteers as part of a partnership between the school district and the United Way.

Nearly twenty years ago Linda moved to Minnesota where she continued to work in philanthropic endeavors, leading fundraising and community engagement with the Minnesota 4-H Foundation, Catholic Charities of St Paul and Minneapolis and Washburn Center for Children.

"I am privileged as a philanthropic professional to help people experience the joy of giving," said Ortner. "I help them make connections between something they really care about and their financial support."

It's this partnership and relationship building that helped Ortner raise millions of dollars at Washburn Center to create a state-of-art children's mental health center. The center, which is now a model for the region and elsewhere, was designed to provide quality mental health care in a nature-infused, healing environment for both children and their families.

Following this project, Ortner completed a graduate program in organizational leadership, which galvanized her desire to make a broader impact in health care and led her to Mercy Hospital Foundation.

"The opportunity to work with Mercy Hospital and the north metro really speaks to me," said Ortner. "It brings me back to my roots, working with a true community hospital. Our work can help ensure that top quality health care remains accessible for this community."

She received additional certification as a sexual assault nurse examiner and started a forensic program on the Unity campus in 2001, which is supported by the foundation and your donor gifts. Through her leadership and dedication, this program has grown to 10 hospitals across the Twin Cities. She is a committed, strong voice for patients and patient's rights.

Nurses were nominated based on professionalism, bedside manner, patient interaction, credentials and experience, impact on an organization, leadership, and an "it" factor exemplifying kindness, compassion and empathy.

Thanks to your generosity, we are heading into the home stretch of our three-year capital campaign, including renovation at both Mercy Hospital campuses. The projects improve services to ensure access to high-quality care for patients and enhance the practice and work environment for providers and staff.

Both emergency departments were enhanced, and the surgical suites and ICU were expanded increase flexibility and increase access, consolidated mental health and addiction programs, established a new orthopedic patient unit and remodeled key hospital infrastructure, including the laboratory.



In October the newly remodeled cafeteria reopened to once again provide quality meal service to patients, family, visitors and staff.

Projects that remain to be completed by year end and through July 2019 are:

- kitchen
- PACU/ Pre- and Post-op surgery
- registration and waiting.


