How to Contact a Patient in the Hospital

There are many ways to connect virtually



SEND MAIL

- The U.S. mail is a simple, low-tech way to share letters, photos, cards and more.
- When addressing your envelope, include the patient's name, unit and room number as well as the <u>main hospital address</u> (call the <u>hospital main number</u> if you don't know the unit and room number).



CALL

- Call the <u>hospital main number</u> and give the patient's name (and unit and room number if you know it).
- Ask to be connected to the patient's room.
- Remember: you may need to keep the call short as the patient may tire easily.



TEXT, EMAIL OR VIDEO CHAT

(patient is able to use their own device)

- If the patient has their own device with the ability to receive texts, emails or video calls, contact them this way.
- Consider including a photo or music that they might find comforting.
- Remember: using their phone and responding quickly may be difficult.



REQUEST A CARE TO CONNECT VIDEO MEETING

(patient does not have or is unable to use their own device)

- Allina Health's patient video conferencing service, Care to Connect, allows multiple family members to connect remotely via video while they are in hospital.
