I wanted to take the opportunity to thank all Courage Kenny Foundation donors for your support in 2020. We are sincerely grateful for your generosity that has allowed Courage Kenny to continue providing essential services to our clients through the pandemic. COVID-19 significantly impacted the entire nonprofit Allina Health system. Furthermore, our disability community was hard-hit by the pandemic. Many struggled to stay active, socially connected and employed, even more than the general population. The pandemic brought changes in treating patients, working with clients, new procedural protocols, and adapting to shifting guidelines to keep employees, clients and patients healthy.

Despite all the changes and safety adaptations, we accomplished remarkable things this year because of your support:

- Courage Kenny served 92,747 clients during 2020 even though services were significantly reduced for almost two months.
- Our staff embraced the new challenge of supporting patients recovering from COVID-19 through inpatient and outpatient therapy.
- Adaptive Sports & Recreation and Aquatics and Fitness created new virtual programming to keep clients connected and active.
- We held the first virtual Art of Possibilities Art Show & Sale where 175 artists with disabilities displayed 294 pieces of artwork. The show resulted in the sale of nearly 40% of the art.
- Generous donors committed the majority of the funding needed for the \$1.5 million Phase One of the TRP expansion project.



Your 2020 return on investment



2,000+ people participated in virtual **Adaptive Sports & Recreation and Aquatics and Fitness** programs after your donations made it possible to pivot quickly to a virtual environment.

88% of Adaptive Sports & Recreation participants reported **increased confidence**
93% reported **feeling better physically**
96% reported **having fun**.

\$53,000 in **ABLE (Activity Based Locomotor Exercise)** scholarship distribution made possible by donors to make this critical program accessible to more clients.

When the ABLE program had to be closed during the early months of the pandemic, clients saw decreases in strength, flexibility and overall health. Your support helped clients return to ABLE as soon as it was safe, and work toward their pre-pandemic levels of fitness.

95% of clients in Driver Assessment and Training who took driving lessons went on to pass their driver's test.

Your support helped clients retain **housing and employment** during the economic recession last year.

98% of clients in **Independent Living Skills** reported stable housing after one year of entering their program.

100% of clients who secured employment through **Vocational Services** found a position that met at least two of their three employment goals related to hours, pay and job type.



205 patients in the **Transitional Rehabilitation Program** spent an average of 63 days in intensive rehabilitation with the goal of moving to more independent living.
