Your 2019 Return on Investment

1,585 seniors used Aquatics and Fitness programs in 2019 to remain healthy and independent.

94% of aquatics and fitness users report feeling more confident, and 90% say that it has helped them better carry out their daily activities.

More than **900** therapy sessions were provided by the new donor-funded Lokomat robotic gait training device in Golden Valley.
