Marne Louters Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine



2nd Year Nursing Scholarship

Ida immigrated to America from Germany at age seven. While she grew up in New Ulm and started a business career and family, she never forgot her relatives and family in the old country. Her efforts to help those suffering from the effects of war in Germany and Austria during WWI earned her a medal and citation from the German Red Cross to thank her.

Ida died in 1969 and in November 1970, Loretto Hospital (now NUMC) received \$2,000 in a trust, specified for a nursing scholarship which began distributing funds in the early 2000's. Each year a second year nursing student is eligible to receive her \$1,000 support.
