

Determining Your Health Insurance Coverage

Questions to ask before your hospital stay

Coverage for your medical care for pregnancy, labor, birth and postpartum will vary, according to your health insurance plan. It is your responsibility to know this information. To learn what your plan covers, call your insurance provider during the early weeks of your pregnancy (the phone number is often printed on the back of your membership card). Use this worksheet as a guide to help you get a clear idea, in advance, of your coverage.
