

Development of the Charge of Quarters Duty — Alternate Form Study



Help us research a way to get our soldiers safely back to duty after concussion.

You can participate in a research study to help medical providers know when Service Members with a concussion should return to challenging activities such as military duty. Receive \$50 in gift cards in appreciation for your time.

One of the skills that soldiers need, to help ensure they are safe during duty, is the ability to multi-task. Multi-tasking requires that a person shifts their focus back and forth between two or more activities. After a concussion, this can be difficult to do.

Courage Kenny Research Center helped develop a multi-tasking test for the U.S. Department of Defense and is looking for **two groups of volunteers** to participate in this study to help learn if it is effective:

1. People with **an acquired brain injury** (such as concussion, traumatic brain injury, stroke) and
2. People **without** a history of acquired brain injury.

Participating in the study involves:

- ✓ Coming to two testing sessions at Mercy or Abbott Northwestern Hospital that would be scheduled at your convenience. Each session lasts 1 – 1½ hours.
- ✓ Taking tests at each session including multi-tasking tests and other tests that challenge your memory and concentration.
